

Charitable Giving Coalition Urges Support for Strengthened Charitable Giving Incentives So Americans #GiveMore on #GivingTuesdayNow and Beyond May 2020

As we approach #GivingTuesdayNow, the Charitable Giving Coalition—a coalition of associations representing thousands of charitable and faith-based organizations across the country—thanks all Americans who have made charitable donations since the outset of the novel coronavirus pandemic. We also appreciate Congress's inclusion of enhanced charitable giving incentives, including a temporary above-the-line universal deduction, in the recently enacted CARES Act.

As our organizations continue to provide vital services to families, workers, and communities affected by COVID-19, it is critical that Congress provide additional relief to donors and charities so they can continue to achieve their missions now and in the future. This includes further strengthening of charitable giving incentives so that Americans are encouraged to #givemore during these challenging times. Congress can do this by:

1) Expanding the temporary universal charitable deduction

• Increase the \$300 cap:

The existing cap is too low and, in many cases, may simply capture giving that donors had already planned. A higher cap will stimulate additional giving by encouraging middle-income donors to make larger donations to more charitable organizations.

• Extend the deduction beyond 2020:

To ensure charities receive relief throughout the crisis and recovery period, extend the temporary universal charitable deduction beyond 2020.

2) Enhancing other incentives to encourage giving

• Allow new gifts to be deducted on 2019 returns:

To ensure charities receive immediate relief, allow all taxpayers (itemizers and non-itemizers) making donations between March 13 (day of national emergency declaration) and July 15 to claim those gifts on their 2019 tax filing.

• Extend and expand temporary suspension of AGI limitations:

Further aid would be provided to charities by extending the ability of donors to deduct 100% of their cash gifts through 2021 and including gifts to donor-advised funds. This would make it easier for donors with such funds to make a single gift this year to the fund and support multiple charities out of that gift.

• Increase charitable giving from middle-income seniors for recovery efforts by enacting the Legacy IRA Act:

As an additional priority to consider, Congress should build on the existing IRA Charitable Rollover to support middle-income seniors who have a charitable intent but also need retirement income. The bipartisan Legacy IRA Act (H.R. 3832/S. 1257) would expand the IRA Charitable Rollover to allow seniors starting at age 65 to make tax-free IRA rollovers to charities through life-income plans. This expansion to lower the age is even more needed as the CARES Act lessened the incentive for IRA Charitable Rollover gifts by including a one-year freeze on the mandate that IRA holders age 72 and older make a minimum annual withdrawal from their retirement accounts.

Again, we urge you to expand and strengthen these charitable giving incentives in future COVID-19 relief packages to help Americans #givemore. Thank you for your leadership and commitment to America's charitable community.
