- Volunteers persist!







Open to the public

 Tuesdays & Fridays for donations - 10 a.m - 2 p.m.

The process:

- Open bags, boxes, piles
- Assess condition
- Price
- Sort into categories
- Pack into moving boxes
- Repeat until June





Shared Purpose & Common Goal

- September May
 - Process, sort, price, and pack donations
- September secure venue for next year
- January finalize details
 - Moving company
 - Publicity
 - Supplies
 - Refreshments
 - Extra volunteers
 - Company for unsold books
- 2 days before sale move books to venue
- Day before sale unpack 800 boxes of books in 8 hours





Pandemic Threatens Our Future

- 2020
 - COVID lockdowns shut down collection and annual sale
 - All inventory sold online, and turned a profit
 - Lost our warehouse
- 2021 What is our future?
- Return in 2021? Or create some other new business to support the Orchestra?





2022 - One More Sale....then Decide

2021 - host one more sale to test local market

2022 - Record-breaking annual sale grossed > \$89,000

Increased expenses cut our contribution to the Orchestra, yet we still donated \$45,000
