Goal

To create a fundraiser event for our volunteers that raises an additional \$50,000-60,000 beyond the \$400,000+ raised by our primary fundraiser, Christmas Gree Elegance—all to support our magnificent Spokane Symphony Orchestra.

Why it works & how it Works

Our first **Upscale Sale** yielded proceeds of only \$7,000, and each subsequent year saw a dramatic increase, such that our most recent sale brought in over eleven times that amount.

We found, as we initially suspected, that people really embrace the idea of donating their unwanted household items as a means of helping fund our orchestra, especially due to the user-friendly method we've refined over the years regarding collecting the items. It works like this. Our volunteers respond to a donor's call by visiting their home and packing the appropriate items. (Oversize articles are set aside and picked up separately by truck.) The owners are given a donation form for taxes. We store the items for next year. We also work closely with a local estate sale company that invites our volunteers to come pack up appropriate items from the residue of estates they sell off.

Our sales offer artworks, books, linens, clothing, jewelry, and high-end handbags as well as china and glass tableware and decorations, furniture, including chairs, sofas, dining sets, and outdoor furnishings, and even luggage, toys, sports equipment, and electronics. Our loyal customers enjoy the higher level of quality we offer than can be found at the local second-hand shops and thrift stores.

The Volunteer Organization

(Headed by a committee of 5 people)

Chairman's Duties:

Site location, storage contracts, supplies, pickup and delivery arrangements.

Volunteer chair placement Duties:

Volunteers for setup, pricing, & takedown.

Pricer Duties:

Price items, oversee the layout (following a schematic), and train other pricers.

Advertisment Duties:

Posters, street signs, newspaper print ads, Facebook, website, Craigslist, media.

Person at Large:

Art pricer, and all around go getter.

Growth of our Fundraiser

The steadily increasing size of our sales has resulted in our need to rent larger and larger spaces. Therefore, we now work with a local commercial realty company to help us locate the perfect site each year. We have required more tables, jewelry cases, locking cases, shelving, and clothes racks each year. (Some items were donated, and some were bought). Additionally, we had to produce signage we could re-use each year. These are startup costs not shown in this budget.

Fun For Everyone

Our volunteers tell us this is the most enjoyable fundraiser of the year for them. We have teams for each area of goods. Volunteers price, clean and display items, inviting volunteers to meet new people and socialize while working. And as an extra thank you to them, we host a pizza party in June at a city park.
