- **120** Grants to orchestras totaling **\$2,553,042** to create more equitable, diverse, and inclusive organizational cultures
- 1668 Grants for 539 musicians of color totaling \$1,191,736 as part of the National Alliance for Audition Support (NAAS), in partnership with Sphinx and New World Symphony
- **64** Grants to orchestras totaling **\$3,220,900** to advance innovation within orchestras and their communities
- **52** Grants to composers and orchestras totaling **\$551,750** to support performances of works by women composers
- **191** Grants to musicians and orchestras totaling \$76,450 to shine a light on musicians' work in their communities and support online pandemic programming
