Musicians are taking action to learn more about the wood most commonly used in bows for stringed instruments. Pernambuco wood is used to make most advanced student and professional bows for stringed instruments. The Pernambuco tree (*Paubrasilia echinata*, also known as Brazil wood) grows only in Brazil's Atlantic Rainforest and its populations are threatened. While finished Pernambuco bows outside of Brazil can be traded and transported across the globe without special permits, bow makers and owners can take the following actions to be informed and support the conservation effort:
